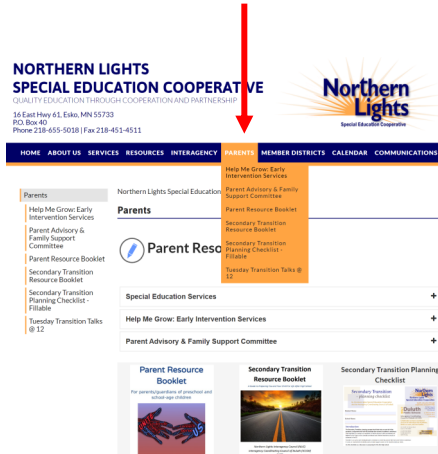

Purpose

The purpose of the Northern Lights Special Education Cooperative is to provide, by cooperative efforts, comprehensive special education services within member districts for children and youth having significant learning needs due to disability or developmental delay.

Services to families and districts

The Northern Lights Special Education Cooperative promote and facilitate opportunities, events, resources, and publications as a way of providing information to families of students with disabilities.

Interagency Council

The purpose of Northern Lights Interagency Council is to provide eligible children with disabilities and their families with a coordinated, multi-disciplinary, interagency, intervention services system that is family-centered and community based.

Services to parents include:

- Provide Help Me Grow: Early Intervention Services
- Support an Autism support groups for parents
- Provide parent resources online (www.nlsec.org/parents) and distribution Northern Lights Interagency Council Annual Report
- Support a parent Facebook group
- Provide information and training to parents on Secondary Transition and preparing their child for a successful transition to life after high school.

Interagency Council Sub-committees

There are 3 sub-committees that work in conjunction with the Northern Lights Interagency Council.

- Parent Advisory and Family Support Committee
- Public Awareness Committee
- Secondary Transitions/Work Based Learning Committee

These sub-committees are comprised of parents, local agencies, county and school personnel who plan and carry out a variety of activities for children with disabilities and their families.
